

## Jesus Paul And The Law

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### Jesus Paul And The Law

Jesus ministered under the Mosaic Law. Paul made it clear that the Church is not under the Law (Romans 6.14) and that one cannot live a victorious Christian life under the Law. Paul taught that one lives the Christian life by faith, under grace, by the power of the Holy Spirit. The Mosaic Law knew nothing of this.

Jesus lived as a Jew, in obedience to the Law of Moses, and he restricted his mission to "the lost sheep of the house of Israel" (Mt. 15:24). Paul devoted himself primarily to the conversion of Gentiles. He held that Gentiles could be saved apart from circumcision and other works of the Law, asserting that Christ was "the end of the Law" (Ro. 10:3).

We, according to Paul, died to the law, meaning that its ability to identify us as sinners and demand our life in payment for our sins was fulfilled through the sacrifice of Jesus.

### What did Paul teach about God's law?

Part of the reason some believe Paul changed what Jesus taught is the perception that Paul's teaching on grace means that obeying God's law is no longer required. Before addressing this commonly held teaching, let's consider what Jesus Christ taught on these important subjects. Jesus' teaching about law and grace

Therefore, it is clear that Paul meant "Christ is the goal, purpose or objective of the law" in Romans 10:4—not that Jesus put an end to the law! Often Paul's words are distorted and misapplied in an attempt to teach that keeping God's law is no longer required.

### Christ Is the End of the Law? - Life, Hope & Truth

Paul's gospel is a grace gospel, not a kingdom gospel. Paul's gospel of salvation is Christ died for our sins and rose again (1 Corinthians 15.1-4). Jesus' gospel and the gospel of the Twelve was Jesus was the promised Messiah. No one today preaches one is saved by believing Jesus was the promised Messiah.

Second, Paul's devotion to the Law would have provided him motivation to be present in Jerusalem during Passover—a time where both he and Jesus would have been in close proximity. Third, as a Pharisee, Paul would have been keenly interested in the teaching of a popular, if unconventional, rabbi.

### Paul never said the Law was abolished. Read for yourself

There are some who argue that, since Jesus did not "abolish" the Law, then the Law is still in effect—and still binding on New Testament Christians. But Paul is clear that the believer in Christ is no longer under the Law: "We were held in custody under the Law, locked up until faith should be revealed.

### What does it mean that Jesus fulfilled the law, but did ...

In the Greek, the wording is, "to those without law, as without law -- (not being without law to God, but within law to Christ) -- that I might gain those without law." ( 1 Corinthians 9:21, YLT) It is not clear exactly what Paul means by the phrase, "the law of Christ".

Dr. Wright argues that in Rom 2:14, Paul writes of the "Gentiles who do not have the law by nature," in contrast, implicitly, to the Jews who do have the Torah by "nature". 10 In this case, Paul's language fits neatly into the scholastic category of "second nature," which is a kind of habit or custom.

Paul dares to say that God doesn't care about oxen and that he didn't send that law for the sake of oxen. A little earlier, he had said the same thing about food. "Foods for the stomach, and the stomach for foods, but God will destroy both it and them" (1 Cor. 6:13).

### Does Paul teach that believers are under the Mosaic Law?

Paul's central convictions made it difficult for him to explain the proper role of Jewish law in the life of his converts. Paul believed that the God of Israel was the one true God, who had redeemed the Israelites from bondage in Egypt, given the Israelites the law, and sent his Son to save the entire world.

### Paul's Contradictions of Jesus

In Galatians, Paul rebemoans Galatian Christians who wish to keep sabbath and observe the new moon as provided in the Law, Paul then says "anathema" -- cursed -- are those who wish to be just / justified by keeping such parts of the Law, i.e., sabbath, monthly festivals, etc.

### Paul Abolished Sabbath - Jesus' words Only

The great rejection of law in Paul's writings is said by Dunn to focus on the Law's function of separating God's people from other nations via the emphasis on Sabbath, circumcision, and dietary laws.
