Critical thinkers are open and receptive to all ideas and arguments, even those with which they may disagree. Critical thinkers reserve judgment on a message until they have examined the claims, logic, reasoning, and evidence used.

Critical Thinking & Reasoning: Logic and the Role of Arguments

A crucial part of critical thinking is to identify, construct, and evaluate arguments . In everyday life, people often use "argument" to mean a quarrel between people. But in logic and critical thinking, an argument is a list of statements, one of which is the conclusion and the others are the premises or assumptions of the argument.

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Secondly, all of the argument's premises are true. Then the argument is cogent, and is, therefore, good. For example: About 97% of climate experts agree that humans are causing global warming. Therefore, probably, humans are causing global warming. As you may have noticed, every argument that has false premises is bad.

Basically, it means that you are using reason and logic to come to a conclusion about an issue or decision you are tangling with. And clear, sound reasoning is something that will help you every day. 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Critical thinking is the opposite of regular, everyday thinking. Moment to moment, most thinking happens automatically. When you think critically, you deliberately employ any of the above intellectual tools to reach more accurate conclusions than your brain automatically would (more on this in a bit).
