The infant caregiver may move with the infants into the practicing toddler group, or, if the children are comfortable with the new caregiver, she may move back to receive a new group of infants. This same slow process, focusing on each child's adjustment to a new environment, takes place throughout the age groups, including the movement of older toddlers (young threes) to the preschool program.

Touchpoints are times when infants and toddlers are making developmental advances, but the advances are preceded by behavioral regressions. By sharing these predictable developmental patterns with parents, educators can reduce families' stress and improve their caregiving.

Design spaces where infants and toddlers can freely explore and caregivers can be close by. This allows you to pay more attention to engaging in responsive interactions with children. Also, an environment that is safe for infants and toddlers to move and explore freely supports their developing sense of independence and lessens the need for redirection.
